

# INFORMATION

## NOF (IADR Scandinavian Division) Hatton Award Competition:

- 1) The objective of the award is to encourage young outstanding dental scientist to carry out research.
- 2) The competition is limited to those candidates who have carried out their research as part of undergraduate/professional training (research undertaken as an undergraduate science student, as a dental student, or at a time of pursuing an intercalated science degree while in training as a dental student) **or** would have carried out research as part of a higher degree, either a Masters or PhD or as part of specialty training **or** are candidates whose research was performed within three (3) years of the award of a PhD.
- 3) Conditional on your presentation at the PER/IADR conference being accepted, you are invited to participate in the NOF's Hatton Award Competition during the conference. Please note that you must be a member of NOF to participate.
- 4) Announce at registration to the conference that you will to participate in the Competition
- 5) If you are making a poster presentation during the conference, you may use this poster in the Competition. If you will be holding an oral presentation during the conference, you must prepare a poster for the Competition. Its measurements should be as for other posters presented in the conference.
- 6) A three-person jury will visit the competition posters and assess them as follows: The presenter will have 10 minutes to present the research project, including pointing out results and illustrations on the poster. The jury members then will have the opportunity to question the presenter during a further 5 minutes.
- 7) The two winners will be announced at the NOF General Assembly
- 8) The two winners will receive a monetary award (1000 euro each) and a certificate. The winners will also have the opportunity to compete in the "world final" IADR/Unilever Hatton Awards at the IADR conference the following year, representing NOF. Expenses in connection with this attendance (airfare, hotel and meeting registration) will be covered by Unilever.
- 9) Applicants for the NOF Hatton Award Competition in Helsinki, 12-15 September, 2012 must submit an abstract for presentation at the PER/IADR meeting in Finland. (<http://www.iadr.org/i4a/pages/index.cfm?pageID=4015>) Deadline 13 april 2012. In addition, a copy of the abstract and a covering letter must also be sent to the chair of the NOF Hatton Committee, prof. Gunhild Strand (Gunhild.strand@iko.uib.no).
